DRAFT MEETING MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) Aeronautics Commission was held in the I-80 Room of the WYDOT University Training Building on Wednesday, February 14, 2024. Chairman Bruce McCormack presided, calling the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman McCormack led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. ROLL CALL

IV. AGENDA ADJUSTMENTS

There were no adjustments to the agenda.

V. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Vice Chairman Blann, seconded by Commissioner Maier, and unanimously carried to approve minutes from the December 19, 2023, education session and the January 23, 2024, business meeting.

VI. UPDATES/DISCUSSIONS

A. CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE

Chairman McCormack presented the Chairman's Update.

Chairman McCormack reminded the commission that the May meeting will be held in northwest Wyoming. The group will tour the airports in Cody, Powell, Cowley, and Greybull. Chairman McCormack will work with Ms. Chapman to set up a tour of GT Aeronautics, a drone manufacturer, located on the Powell airport. If any commissioners have any requests for the trip, please share them with the chairman, Mr. Olsen, or Ms. Chapman.

Chairman McCormack congratulated the Wyoming Airports Coalition on hosting a successful legislative reception on February 13. Several legislators attended the reception and had good discussions with the airports, commissioners, and division staff.

B. DIRECTOR'S UPDATE

Director Westby presented the Director's Update.

2024 Budget Session

Director Westby reported that the department is prepared for the legislative session. The appropriations bill is the largest concern, but the department will monitor and support several smaller transportation bills.

Two transportation bills were included on a consent list that failed on the first day of the legislative session. One of the bills—on light, high-profile vehicles—will be reintroduced in the near future. Director Westby shared that he has provided testimony on some of the bills, but none impact a significant portion of the agency.

Association of General Contractors (AGC) Conference

Director Westby recently addressed the AGC membership at their conference in Casper. He spoke about his time as director, the direction of the agency, and the AGC's connection to WYDOT's mission and vision. The director's address also touched on improving relationship with cities, towns, and counties; filling vacancies; and increasing state funding.

Director Westby informed the AGC of future WYDOT projects, including the construction of vertical infrastructure. A significant amount of funding will be available for bridge projects in 2025, and the director wanted to ensure the contractors were prepared to bid on those projects.

HDR Space Analysis

Director Westby reminded the commission that WYDOT recently contracted HDR to conduct a space analysis of WYDOT headquarters. Before spending state funds on a new building, Director Westby wanted to ensure that the current facilities are used efficiently and at maximum capacity. A report from the analysis detailing recommendations and suggested efficiencies is expected in the next month.

American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) Washington Briefing

Director Westby recently attended the AASHTO Washington Briefing in Washington D.C. The urgent need to complete Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Reauthorization was a major topic of discussion at the meeting.

Another major topic of the meeting was the need to increase funding to smaller, rural states. The director had a chance to speak with some of the legislators on the committees and subcommittees addressing the issue, and he felt that they were aware of the needs of smaller states.

Infrastructure Messaging

The director reported that he is committed to educating legislators—congressional and state—on the impact and importance of maintaining infrastructure. A good, reliable transportation system is critical to not only the citizens, but also to the three industries—mineral and natural resource extraction, tourism, and agriculture—that are the state's largest revenue streams. The main point of his message is that well-maintained transportation infrastructure relies on adequate, stable funding.

Following a comment from Commissioner Duck on the commission's tour of the Transportation Management Center (TMC) during the previous day's education session, Director Westby shared that Wyoming leads the nation in innovation and development of state-of-the-art transportation management systems. Director Westby shared that Vince Garcia, Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) program manager, and his team are strategic and forward-thinking in regards to the implementation and adaptation new systems and technologies to improve Wyoming's transportation system.

C. ADMINISTRATOR'S UPDATE

Administrator Olsen presented the Administrator's Update.

Federal Updates

2024 Appropriations

The FAA is funded through March 8, 2024, under a continuing resolution (CR). Congress is working on an appropriations bill to fund the Department of Transportation (DOT) and the FAA, but another CR may be needed until legislation can be passed.

FAA Reauthorization

On February 8, 2024, the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation marked up and approved a bipartisan, five-year reauthorization bill—out of committee. Of the 80 issue items on the manager's amendment list, only one item was discussed and voted on separately. The item was an amendment to raise the commercial pilot retirement age to 67, and it failed to pass by one vote. The remaining items were approved as a consent list.

The next steps are unclear, but the bill will have to be considered on the Senate floor. The Senate Commerce Committee could conference with the House to come to agreement on amendments or the Senate could reconcile the Commerce Committee's version with the House bill.

The Senate's draft bill proposes an increase in Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funding—from \$3.5 billion to \$4 billion annually. It authorizes \$350 million for Per- and Polyfluorinated Substances (PFAS)-free firefighting foam transition efforts. The draft bill also provides funding to hire and train additional air traffic controllers and aircraft inspectors.

House Hearing

On February 6, the House Aviation Subcommittee held a hearing on "The State of American Aviation and the Federal Aviation Administration" with the new FAA administrator, Michael Whitaker. The main topics of the hearing were reauthorization, the oversight of manufactures including Boeing, the FAA's authority over airports that are temporarily housing migrants, and changing the retirement age of commercial airline pilots.

PFAS-free Firefighting Foam Transition

On February 8, the Department of Defense identified a second fluorine-free firefighting foam. To date, only one alternative product has been commercially available. An additional option will ensure that more airports are able to purchase fluorine-free foam and transition away from materials containing PFAS.

Administrator Olsen reported that federal guidance is still lacking on how to successfully transition to PFAS-free foams. Airports across the country are unsure how to proceed and are concerned about the liability for the continued use of foams containing PFAS. Many organizations, including the National Association of State Aviation Officials (NASAO), continue to press the FAA to develop and provide clear guidance on the process.

The Jackson Hole Airport has begun work to transition to the new fluorine-free foam, and Administrator Olsen believes they may be one of the first airports in the country to do so. Jackson's firefighting trucks were due for replacement, which made the transition process more straightforward. Other airports with newer equipment are less certain how to proceed.

Regional Updates

Meeting with FAA

On January 24, Administrator Olsen participated in a meeting with the FAA regional administrator. The Northwest Mountain Region holds quarterly meetings to discuss issues with the FAA. The issues discussed at the January meeting included the loss of training opportunities previously provided by the FAA, the inability to assess liquidated damages on contractors, delays in grants issuance, and the timeliness of reimbursements for COVID-19 relief funds.

Following a question from Vice Chairman Blann, Mr. Schutzman reported that the division has outstanding reimbursements from the FAA—some that are over 120 days. One of the main issues with the reimbursement process is that an FAA staff member in Washington D.C. reviews the requests for reimbursement, and the division does not have any contact with the reviewer. Additionally, no reasons are given for rejected requests, which leaves the division unsure how to address issues with the request(s) or whom to contact. The outstanding requests total approximately \$2 million.

In response to a question from Commissioner DeVore, Administrator Olsen shared that the percentage of contracts where liquidated damages are assessed—usually when a contractor is incompetent or significantly delayed—is small. He stated that exact totals could be shared with the commission, but from his time as a program manager, it was only a half-dozen out of hundreds of contracts. There are also a few additional cases where an airport sponsor was able to negotiate fair and equitable damages with a contractor.

State Updates

2024 Budget Session

Administrator Olsen reported that the legislative session began on Monday, February 12. Currently, there are no bills pertaining to aviation, but the division will monitor the bills closely and work with the Wyoming Airports Coalition (WAC) if any such bills emerge.

Administrator Olsen reported that an amendment to the appropriations bill allocates funds to provide state matches to Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) grants and extends the time that funds will be available. The department is hopeful the amendment will pass.

Quarterly Meeting with Commercial Service Airports

Administrator Olsen and the program managers met with the commercial service airport managers in Casper on January 25. The division meets with the airports for quarterly, in-person meetings to discuss issues that impact airports across the state and provide updates on programs and priorities.

Division and Department Updates

Pilot Recruitment

The new pilot in Flight Operations—hired at the end of 2023—has completed initial training and been cleared by Risk Management to begin piloting state flights. Administrator Olsen plans to hire at least one more pilot.

Administrator Olsen believes the pilot shortage is easing slightly. The major carriers have slowed hiring efforts, but it will take time before smaller airlines and other sectors of the industry experience relief from the shortage.

D. AIR SERVICE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM UPDATE

Ms. Johnson presented the Air Service Development Program Update.

General Matters

January Traffic

Ms. Johnson reported that January load factors dropped from the peak totals experienced in November and December, which is typical for the time of year. Gillette finished the month with a 76 percent load factor, and Rock Springs and Sheridan were close to 70 percent.

Future Bookings

Ms. Johnson reported that bookings for February are similar to January numbers. Bookings are trending upwards for March and April.

Industry Updates

Ms. Johnson reported that JetBlue and Spirit Airlines have filed an appeal to a federal judge's prohibition of their proposed merger. An appeal hearing will be held in June, but both airlines have emphasized their ability to build successful, standalone plans if the appeal is denied.

The Department of Justice has also requested more information on Alaska Airlines' proposed purchase of Hawaiian Airlines.

The major U.S. airlines recently reported fourth quarter and 2023 earnings. Delta and United Airlines reported the strongest performance with 9.5 percent and eight percent adjust pre-tax profit margins (respectively) for the year. In general, the ultra-low-cost airlines reported weaker numbers as they struggled to recover the pre-pandemic demand for service. Allegiant Airlines is the only ultra-low-cost carrier that produced any meaningful revenues in 2023.

United Airlines recently announced its intention to build a fleet plan that includes no Boeing 737 MAX 10 aircraft. The airline currently has 277 MAX 10s on its order book. While no orders have been canceled, the airline has removed the aircraft from internal plans.

Ms. Johnson reported that 1.4 million passengers traveled through Wyoming airports in 2023—the highest total number of passengers ever recorded in the state. These numbers were achieved even though many Wyoming airports were still experiencing capacity constraints. Ms. Johnson credited the airport managers for their diligent efforts to build a strong local demand for air service at their airports.

Following a question from Vice Chairman Blann, Ms. Johnson stated that she and Glenn Januska, director of the Natrona County International Airport, have discussed strategies for improving the load factors for the Casper-Salt Lake City (SLC) route. Similar discussions have occurred with Amy Terrell, director of the Laramie Regional Airport, about the Laramie-Denver route. Ms. Terrell believes that the flight times are not convenient for her customers, so many are choosing to drive to other airports. SkyWest Airlines is aware of the issue, and Ms. Johnson will continue to work with Ms. Terrell on promotion efforts for the route.

In response to a follow-up question from Vice Chairman Blann, Mr. Januska clarified that Casper's current minimum revenue guarantee (MRG) with the state ends in June 2024, but the MRG with SkyWest ended on December 31, 2023. SkyWest presented a proposal for a new MRG for either a six- or 12-month term. The proposal will be presented to the Natrona County Board of County Commissioners for their consideration on March 5. Mr. Januska believes that the funds allocated by the Aeronautics Commission for the MRG will be insufficient to cover the entire six-month contract and he anticipates a future request to increase funding.

Mr. Januska shared that the airport surveyed customers to uncover the reasons they are not using the Casper-SLC route. He does not believe that airfares or flight frequency are barriers, but his team is still working to identify the main issue(s) that keep customers from using the service. He hopes that the survey data analysis, in combination with increased marketing efforts, will increase demand.

Vice Chairman Blann requested a market analysis from Mead and Hunt be included with any future funding requests for the Casper-SLC route to help the commission make informed decisions regarding funding awards. Commissioner DeVore believes that the route is cost-effective and reliable, but the airport needs to increase community awareness for the route to be successful.

Following a question from Commissioner Duck, Ms. Johnson stated that the record number of passengers was made possible by incremental increases at all Wyoming airports.

Administrator Olsen shared that Laramie faces additional challenges in improving flight schedules. Laramie is part of the Essential Air Service (EAS) program and therefore has to compete against other EAS markets for the limited number of overnight SkyWest flights. Following a question from Chairman McCormack, Administrator Olsen shared that the EAS is a popular program that is well funded by Congress, but it does need significant reform.

Standard Reports

Air Service Enhancement Program (ASEP) Budget Forecast Report Ms. Johnson reported no changes to the ASEP Budget Forecast Report.

Capacity Purchase Agreement (CPA) Budget Forecast Report

Ms. Johnson reported no changes to the CPA Budget Forecast Report.

Percent of Grant Projects by City Report

Ms. Johnson reported no changes to the Percent of Grant Projects by City Report.

Monthly Load Factors Report

Ms. Johnson reported that the Monthly Load Factors Report was updated to include the most recent load factor data available for each airport.

E. ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM UPDATE

Ms. Palka presented the Engineering and Construction Program Update.

General Matters

Interactive Data Exchange Application (IDEA) Update

Ms. Palka reported that the Airport Pavement Management Program website, or IDEA, will be updated with the latest pavement condition index data in next few weeks. The data is currently undergoing a final review before publication on the public website.

Projects Update

Ms. Palka reported that most projects for the next construction season are in the final design stage. The projects should go out for bid within the next month and come before the commission for approval in April and May.

Standard Reports

Change Orders Report

Ms. Palka reported two new change orders for projects in Jackson and Laramie.

Statewide Line Items Report

Ms. Palka reported two new lines item for an aviation encouragement grant and NAVAID maintenance.

Bid Summary Report

Ms. Palka reported no new bid results.

F. PLANNING AND PROGRAMMING PROGRAM REPORT

Mr. Schutzman presented the Planning and Programming Program Update.

General Matters

Wyoming Aviation Capital Improvement Program (WACIP) Report Formatting Updates

Mr. Schutzman detailed the formatting changes in the newly revised WACIP reports. The new reports list all of the statewide programs and the respective totals. The statewide programs are in the Statewide Line Items Report, and the commission may track spending under the approved line items.

In future years, the budget reports will include lines detailing statewide projects that receive Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funding as a match for other federal grants.

WACIP Update Process

Mr. Schutzman reported that the division is nearing completion on the WACIP update cycle. As it is an annual process, Mr. Schutzman and his team will soon start work on the next update cycle.

The comment period for the current cycle closed on February 2, and staff is working with the FAA Denver Airports District Office (ADO) to review and address comments received from airport sponsors. The FY 2025 budget and the FY 2026-30 plan will be available for commission consideration at the March business meeting.

Priority Rating Model (PRM) Update

Mr. Schutzman reported that the division sent a survey to the airports and consultants to gather issues or concerns with the current PRM, but no responses have been received. If any are received, Mr. Schutzman will bring the items before the PRM task forces.

The division has contracted a third party to facilitate/moderate the PRM task force meetings. The Wyoming Attorney General's office is reviewing the contract, and the division will start scheduling meeting dates as soon as it is approved.

Standard Reports

Administrative Approvals Report

Mr. Schutzman reported there were no administrative approvals this period.

Recovered State Funds Report

Mr. Schutzman reported that there were no recoveries during this period. The total recovered for FY2024 remains at \$79,634.93.

G. UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS PROGRAM UPDATE

Ms. Taylor presented the Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Program Update.

General Matters

UAS Use Case—Avalanche Mitigation

Following the discussion at the January business meeting, Ms. Taylor reached out to Dan Wallace, with WYDOT's Avalanche Program, to inquire about the possibility of using drones for avalanche mitigation. Mr. Wallace is aware of the technology, but current FAA rules prevent the department from using it. The Alaska DOT received a special waiver to use UAS for avalanche mitigation that the contiguous 48 states have not typically been able to receive. Ms. Taylor reported that Washington (state) is currently working with the FAA to expand the use of this technology and WYDOT is closely monitoring those discussions.

Mr. Wallace shared that—to date—WYDOT has not pushed to use the technology for avalanche mitigation because it has not matured enough to be practical and it is cost prohibitive. Currently, there is no platform on the market capable of dropping small charges, but new technology is in development. Once it is approved for commercial application, it is estimated that the system could cost as much as \$100,000 to \$150,000 per unit.

Safety Management System (SMS) Board Meeting Update

Ms. Taylor reported that a SMS board meeting was held last week. Meetings are typically held following incidents, but this meeting was held to discuss obtaining flight waivers from the FAA for flights conducted in controlled airspace. The current methods to obtain permission are cumbersome and/or time consuming, so the department would like to pursue a waiver allowing flights over a specified period—instead of seeking permission for individual flights and missions. Ms. Taylor will work with a consultant and the FAA over the next few months to apply for waivers in Cheyenne, Rawlins, and Sheridan.

Following a question from Commissioner McClain, Mr. Schutzman clarified that controlled airspace extends five nautical miles from any civil airport.

VII. REGULAR BUSINESS

A. FY 2024 WACIP BUDGET MODIFICATIONS

Mr. Schutzman reported one modification this period for an increase of \$40,000 in state funds and \$1,000,000 in federal funds allocated towards projects. The remaining state reserve is currently \$1,823,998.

<u>Action</u>: It was recommended by Mr. Schutzman, moved by Commissioner Duck, seconded by Vice Chairman Blann, and unanimously carried to approve the FY 2024 WACIP budget modifications as presented.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

A. 2024 International Aviation Art Contest

Mr. Schutzman reported that Wyoming restarted the state International Aviation Art Contest. One entry was received from Kynleigh Davis, of Cokeville. Ms. Davis is a student at Cokeville Junior/Senior High School, and her piece is titled "Strength in the Sky."

The division will submit Ms. Davis' artwork to the national contest, sponsored by NASAO if she is successful in the national contest

Chairman McCormack thanked Ms. Davis—who joined the meeting via videoconference—for her submission and commended her for her artistry.

<u>Action</u>: It was recommended by Mr. Schutzman, moved by Vice Chairman Blann, seconded by Commissioner McClain, and unanimously carried to award Kynleigh Davis first place in Group II of the Wyoming competition of the International Aviation Art Contest.

B. CONSIDERATION OF THE AWARD OF THE 2024 CRACK SEAL PROJECT

Ms. Palka reported that bids for the 2024 Crack Seal Project were opened at 9:00 a.m. on February 8, 2024. Three bids were received from qualifying bidders. Participating airports included: Gillette, Hulett, Buffalo, Casper, Lusk, Newcastle, and Douglas

<u>Action</u>: It was recommended by Ms. Palka, moved by Commissioner McClain, seconded by Commissioner Maier, and unanimously carried to approve the award of the 2024 Crack Seal contract to the low bidder, Z&Z Seal Coating, Incorporated, and its subsidiaries of Billings, Montana, having pre-qualified in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the Wyoming Transportation Commission.

IX. EXECUTIVE SESSION

There was no need for an executive session.

X. ANNOUNCEMENTS/REMINDERS

Airport Comments

Chairman McCormack recognized the airport directors in attendance and invited them to provide updates to the commission.

Devon Brubaker, director of the Southwest Wyoming Regional Airport in Rock Springs, provided a brief update on the terminal construction project. The airport is moving forward on the project with a new contract manager at risk—Q&D Construction of Reno, Nevada. The contractor has been awarded a Phase I early package, and work will begin in March.

The airport has received a guaranteed maximum price from Q&D Construction for the remainder of the work on the project, but it is significantly higher than anticipated. Mr. Brubaker is working with the FAA to secure additional funding for the project. He has also discussed the issue with the Aeronautics Division, the Wyoming Business Council, and the Governor's office.

Mr. Brubaker shared that the airport board is in litigation with the previous contractor and seeking to recover all necessary damages, including the cost to finish the project. As the case is not expected to conclude until April 2025, Mr. Brubaker is seeking alternative methods to fund the continuing construction. A successful lawsuit would enable him to recover the project costs to reimburse state and local partners. The airport board is committed to holding the original contractor accountable.

Following a question on project timelines from Chairman McCormack, Mr. Brubaker said he hopes to have project funding secured by May 2024 for construction to recommence as soon as possible. The terminal should be complete by June 2025, which is two years behind the original schedule.

Kyle Butterfield, Riverton city administrator, provided an update on the Central Wyoming Regional Airport and commercial air service activities. He reported that in January 2024 the airport had the highest number of enplanements for that month since 2002. The airport achieved these numbers despite the continued lack of air service capacity. He thanked the commission and the division for their support of air service in Riverton and other Wyoming communities.

Mr. Butterfield reported that the airport recently completed an apron reconstruction project. He stated that almost every piece of pavement has been rehabilitated or replaced in the last 20 years. In the future, he believes a terminal expansion project will be necessary with the increasing traffic, but he appreciates all of the investments the commission has made to date.

Following a question from Vice Chairman Blann, Mr. Butterfield said that the airports catchment area contains about 20,000 potential passengers. In 2023, the airport was able to obtain 13,000 passengers from their catchment area.

Mr. Butterfield is currently the president of the WAC. He thanked the commission for their continued support of the coalition and for attending the coalition's conferences and legislative receptions.

Commission Activities

Ms. Chapman announced that the commission's next business meeting will be held at 1:30 p.m. on March 19, 2024, via videoconference.

Commissioner Comments

Chairman McCormack announced that the Yellowstone Regional Airport will dedicate its terminal in honor of the late Hank Coe—a former state senator who was instrumental in creating legislation supporting air service—at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, June 7, 2024. All of the commissioners are invited to attend the dedication.

XI. ADJOURNMENT

It was moved by Commissioner McClain to adjourn and passed unanimously. Chairman McCormack adjourned the meeting at 11:07 a.m. on February 14, 2024.

EDUCATION SESSION MINUTES

A workshop for the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) Aeronautics Commission was held in the I-80 Room, WYDOT-U Training Building, Cheyenne, on February 13, 2024. The workshop began at 1:00 p.m.

Pilot Wages Summary

At the January 23, 2024 business meeting, the commissioners requested more information on the pilot contracts and wage negotiations for the mainline carriers. Ms. Johnson created an informational handout that listed the effective date of the contract, the term of the contract, and the contract costs for each of the five major airlines.

Air Service Year-end Update

Ms. Johnson provided an overview of the Air Service Development Program's 2023 highlights. She began the presentation by sharing passenger totals, for calendar years 2019-2023, for each commercial service airport. Almost all of the Wyoming airports saw an increase in passenger numbers in 2023. The total enplanements for all Wyoming airports in 2023 was 1,463,810—the highest total passenger traffic ever recorded in the state.

Following a question from Vice Chairman Blann, Ms. Johnson shared that the legislature receives an annual report on air service development but it is aligned with the fiscal year (FY). Legislators also receive quarterly updates on air service. Ms. Johnson and Administrator Olsen are brainstorming methods to share the annual data. Chairman McCormack suggested sharing the data via a press release.

Ms. Johnson provided information on the FY 2023 Air Service Enhancement Program (ASEP) grants. Commissioners may have previously seen this information at the Jackson Hole Air Improvement Resources' Airline Rendezvous, but Ms. Johnson altered the table slightly in the interim. She added a line providing the total cost per passenger for each route supported by the ASEP. Previously, the table only supplied the state's cost per passenger. The additional line item better illustrates the true cost of the service and the value the program provides to the state for its investment.

Following a question from Chairman McCormack, Ms. Johnson explained that the total cost per passenger line item includes the total amount spent by the state and the local partner(s). The state cost per passenger line was not a true comparison between airports and routes as Cheyenne had a larger percentage of grant match than other airports. Therefore, the total cost per passenger line item provides a more accurate comparison between the routes.

Ms. Johnson also provided information detailing FY 2023 expenditures for the Capacity Purchase Agreement (CPA). Since each CPA community receives the same support from the state—60 percent state share with a 40 percent local match—Ms. Johnson did not provide a line item for the total cost per passenger. The state cost per passenger for Gillette was \$11.88, Riverton was \$18.94, Rock Springs was \$14.30, and Sheridan was \$14.11.

Following a question from Chairman McCormack, Ms. Johnson shared that the state cost per passenger is calculated using the airport-specific block hour rate, the number of passengers, the total flight times, and fuel costs. The airline sets the block hour rate for each airport using stage length—the length of time from take-off to landing in a single leg of a flight. Administrator Olsen stated that flights of shorter duration typically have higher block hour rates.

Administrator Olsen explained how SkyWest Airlines calculates Wyoming's share of the CPA. SkyWest reviews the revenue from each route monthly, which is determined by multiplying the total number of monthly passengers by the established average fare. The airline then calculates the route costs by adding the total block hours flown and the fuel costs. If the cost exceeds the revenue, the CPA offsets the difference and the state seeks reimbursement from the local partners. SkyWest bills the state monthly, but are paid quarterly. The contract stipulates that profitable routes receive rolling credits, which can be used in leaner months.

Ms. Johnson also shared initial figures on CPA performance from the first half of FY 2024. To date, no state funds have been expended in Gillette due to rolling credits received in the first two

quarters of the year. Sheridan has also needed very little support for a similarly well-performing route.

Ms. Johnson updated the commission on the progress of the statewide marketing grant project. The division on the to select a consultant/marketing firm. Aeronautics, along with several other WYDOT programs, is working with WYDOT Procurement to develop a comprehensive marketing request for proposal (RFP). The purpose of the RFP is to amass a list of marketing firms that the programs can consult for future projects. The RFP will be finalized and posted in the next few weeks.

Ms. Johnson is currently compiling a list of firms that have expertise in air service or firms that have expressed interest in working with the division in the past. The RFP will be sent to the firms on Ms. Johnson's list once it is posted publicly.

Once the RFP closes later in the spring, the division will be able to engage the firm best equipped to assist the airports with marketing efforts. The chosen agency will also help the division design a comprehensive statewide marketing plan.

Ms. Johnson shared the air service trends that will shape program priorities in 2024. While the pilot constraints are easing, industry experts anticipate the effects of the shortage to linger for the next 12 months. SkyWest feels that retention is trending upward but there is not enough consecutive months of data to confirm the trend.

The division is working with SkyWest to add capacity back to Riverton and Rock Springs, which have been severely constrained for several years. SkyWest is aware of the issue, and discussions are occurring, but no agreements have been reached.

Ms. Johnson shared that another major project in 2024 is the renegotiation of the block hour rates for FY 2025. She and Administrator Olsen are aware that the local partners need to know the rates for budgeting purposes, so they have initiated discussions with SkyWest. Ms. Johnson hopes to update the commission in the next month or so on the progress of the negotiations.

Ms. Johnson is working to ensure that the local markets are ready to support larger aircraft in the future. She does not expect it to happen this year, but she wants to prepare the airports for the eventuality.

Following a question from Commissioner Maier, Ms. Johnson stated that the division is attempting to forecast individual market performance on larger aircraft. The division hopes to provide the airlines with recommendations on which markets or routes can successfully utilize larger aircraft. Administrator Olsen confirmed that more airlines will retire 50-seat single-class, regional jets in favor of larger aircraft in the future. The department remains committed to providing [at least] twice-daily service in all Wyoming markets.

Airport Presentation

Mr. Januska provided an update on the single engine air tanker (SEAT)/large air tanker (LAT) base project at the Natrona County International Airport in Casper. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the U.S. Forest Service funded the project.

The genesis for the project was the Casper Mountain fire in 2012. The Forest Service was interested in having a centrally located base to station large air tankers for fire emergencies.

The current SEAT base consists of a building, a small parking ramp, and a 0.16 acre containment area. Due to the limitations imposed by the size of the current base and concerns over fire retardant entering the stormwater system, the airport began working with the BLM to fund the construction of a new base. It was also impossible to service LATs at the current SEAT base as it could not accommodate the larger aircraft. The Forest Service had to bring in a portable retardant facility to service the LATs, which costs about \$500,000 every time the facility was set up. The facility was set up south of the terminal, away from the SEAT base.

Mr. Januska provided a timeline of the project to-date. The airport initially worked with the BLM on project funding, but hoped to bring the Forest Service into the planning. Since the Forest Service was focused on building a base in Colorado, the airport proceeded to work with the BLM. The airport contracted Ardurra to complete the designs for the facility, with the BLM's approval.

Mr. Januska stated that the airport will pay to design and construct the facility, and the BLM will reimburse the airport once the project is complete. The BLM will then take possession of the facility and the airport will lease the land to the BLM.

In July 2022, once the design for the new SEAT base was 95 percent complete, the Forest Service expressed an interest in expanding the facility to service LATs. Within a week—following discussions with the Forest Service and Ardurra—\$2 million in additional Forest Service funds were added to expand the project scope to include the LAT base. The final designs were completed in November 2022.

The project went out for bid in January 2023, but the bids came in about \$800,000 higher than anticipated. Many discussions and negotiations took place over the following three months until the bid was awarded in April 2023. The BLM and the airport—in the form of a loan to the BLM—provided the additional project funding.

The new SEAT/LAT base will cover 6 acres and consists of a large section of asphalt for incoming aircraft, two concrete pads, a support building, a containment area for the tanks, and a retention basin for the runoff from the tankers. As part of the project, the BLM will also pay to reconstruct a portion of the taxiway leading to the new facility.

Mr. Januska presented several pictures of the construction process. As of January 2024, the concrete pads are installed, the retention basin has been dug and lined, the support building is on site, utilities are installed, and the foundations for the tank facility are constructed. Asphalt paving

will occur in the spring. Mr. Januska anticipates that the facility will be operational in time for the 2024 fire season. He also hopes to have the current SEAT base remediated by the end of the year.

Following a question from Commissioner McClain, Mr. Januska stated that fuel will be supplied to the tankers by trucks from Atlantic Aviation or Aero Center. Following a question from Vice Chairman Blann, Mr. Januska shared that the new facility will be able to accommodate two LATs simultaneously but very large air tankers will be serviced south of the terminal. He also informed the commission that the BLM has a 30-year lease for the facility grounds.

Following a question from Vice Chairman Blann, Mr. Januska provided an update on the National Championship Air Races. He was recently notified that Casper is on the selection committee's shortlist for the new host city. Two other communities are also on the list, but have not been publicly announced. Following a question from Chairman McCormack, Mr. Januska shared that the selection committee intends to announce the new host city by the end of March 2024.

The commission also discussed the use of larger aircraft at the Casper airport and the status of the Salt Lake City route. Mr. Januska shared that, prior to the pandemic, Casper received no financial assistance to support commercial air service. In November 2021, the airport set up a MRG with Delta Airlines. The entire MRG was \$755,000 but after six months, the airport had only used \$56,000. The service was performing so well that the airline scheduled a second flight on the route in October 2022. The second flight did not perform as well as expected, so the schedule was dropped to a once-daily flight.

In order to boost capacity, the airport and airline negotiated to use a 76-seat aircraft on the route. Mr. Januska stated that the load factor levels have been unsatisfactory so far. The airport tried to market the route and support it in other ways, but it continues to underperform. United Airlines flies four flights daily into Casper and have never needed financial assistance, so Mr. Januska knows a profitable model is possible. He is unsure why the Delta route is unable to achieve the same success.

It seemed logical that the airport could move to a larger aircraft—even with a higher cost structure—and still generate revenue from the additional seats. However, the route has not reached a point where the revenue is offsetting the additional costs. There was discussion about scheduling and fares, but neither appear to be the main obstacle to customers using the service.

Following a question from Commissioner Duck, Mr. Januska shared that the there is a possibility to secure additional funding partners to help meet the 60 percent local match.

Cheyenne Old Terminal & Air Traffic Control Tower Tour

Ms. Bean, Mr. Cox, and Mr. Bradshaw provided a tour of the old terminal of the Cheyenne Regional Airport. The building, originally built and opened in 1960, has been vacant since the opening of the new terminal in 2018. The Wyoming Aviation History League sees much potential in the old building and are committed to saving the building and repurposing it for community use.

The League sought community feedback on the building through surveys and in-person visioning sessions. Community members suggested several potential uses for the building including an arts and aviation center, an aviation history museum, office space for Legend Aeroserve, small retail space, and a restaurant and/or bar. The building is large enough that it could be converted into a mixed-use space.

The commission also toured the old air traffic control tower, located next to the old terminal on 8th Avenue.

Transportation Management Center (TMC) Tour

Mr. Garcia presented information on the history and functions of the TMC before leading the commissioners on a tour of the facility. The TMC and Dispatch Center are collocated in adjacent rooms in the basement of the Qwest Building in Cheyenne.

While the TMC and Dispatch Center do coordinate efforts when major events occur, their primary functions differ. The TMC has several functions, including: dispatching the WYDOT maintenance fleet; supplying information on road conditions and weather, crash events, construction, variable speed limits and closures, and AMBER alerts; providing catastrophic event coordination; updating dynamic messaging signs; and so on. Since the centralization of operations at the TMC in 2008, better coordination has insured greater consistency of information and service to the public.

The Dispatch Center principally handles communication and coordination for all Wyoming Highway Patrol (WHP) efforts, statewide. The center provides the communications link between the public, WHP, and other emergency services. Dispatchers ensure that troopers receive the necessary information to aid in emergencies and incidents safely and effectively.

The education session adjourned at 5:05 p.m.

As you are aware, we applied for ASEP funding for a SkyWest MRG to cover the service from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. This was based on service history and what we anticipated would happen when the larger 76 passenger regional jets entered the market (the first part of July). The total request was \$800,000, with the State's portion anticipated to be \$320,000. That application was approved by the Aeronautics Commission. Unfortunately, the service did not perform as we had anticipated. We are now anticipating needing an additional \$598,903, of which we are requesting approval by the Aeronautics Commission of \$399,268 (see breakdown below).

Douglas – Acquire SRE: Notice to Proceed was issued on August 8, 2022, to Floyd's Truck Center of Gillette, WY. The contract amount is \$279,991. Expected delivery is late 2023. Several projects of this type are experiencing further delay in delivery due to Henke relocating their manufacturing plant. Floyd's believes they can have the truck delivered by March 2024. GH

Douglas – Rehab RW 11/29 and Remove Direct Access from Apron to RW: Project was rebid due to high costs. Bidding was reopened and the sponsor will award only Schedule 1, to be constructed in spring 2024. TD

Douglas – Develop General Aviation Hangar Area: Project is in the beginning stages of predesign. TD

Dubois – **Replace Gate:** Design is underway and 95% documents were reviewed in January by the State. MP

Fort Bridger – Reconstruct TW A and SE Apron: Construction complete pending final closeout reports. TD Gillette – Rehabilitate RW 16/34 and 3/21, Design: The initial planning phase of this project is complete. The project will consist of panel replacement. Design is set to begin in 2024 with a goal of opening bids by February 2025. Construction is anticipated for 2025. MP

Gillette – Rehabilitate Apron: Construction on the apron is complete. Lighting upgrades are still taking place and were delayed due to shipping issues. MP

Gillette – South Side Apron Development: Design is underway. MP

Gillette – **Acquire Dedicated Broom:** Project will acquire a dedicated broom. Award was issued to M-B Companies on May 18 with a winning bid of \$791,637. Expected delivery is August 2024. GH

Jackson – Rehabilitate and Expand Deice Pad, TW A, and TW Bypass: Schedules I, VI, and VII are complete. Schedules II, III, and V (V is non-federal) were recently approved for award. Construction anticipated to start May 1. MP

Jackson – Runway rehab - Vehicle Service Road: This project was initially only partially constructed with the runway project due to funding concerns. The runway project came in under budget and, after having the VSR flagged on a 139 inspection, the FAA has agreed to add it back in. Preconstruction meeting scheduled for March 27. Work scheduled to start in April. MP

Jackson – **Stormwater Detention Expansion:** Construction expected to start mid-August. MP

Jackson – Air Traffic Control Tower: Construction expected to start in April. Preconstruction meeting scheduled for April 1. MP

Jackson – Acquire ARFF Truck: Project will acquire a class 5 / 3,000 gallon ARFF vehicle. Award was made to Rosenbauer with a total bid of \$928,515. Expected delivery is spring 2024. GH

Kemmerer – **Acquire Mowing Equipment:** Project will acquire a utility tractor and mower attachment. The project was awarded to Stotz Equipment of Evansville, WY in the bid amount of \$98,900. Equipment is expected to be delivered by early spring 2024. GH

Pinedale – **Acquire SRE:** Project will acquire a loader and attachments to include a bucket and plow. Project was awarded to Tri-State Truck and Equipment with a bid of \$383,804. Expected delivery is summer of 2024. GH

Rawlins – Acquire Mowing Equipment: Project will acquire a small farm type tractor and pull mower deck. Bid was awarded to Stotz Equipment in the amount of \$121,400. Mower has been delivered and the project is currently in the acceptance and finaling phase. GH

Rawlins – Construct GA Terminal Building: Construction started with anticipation of winter closure. Project is scheduled to resume in spring 2024. TD

Riverton – Acquire Loader and Snow Blower: Project was awarded to Honnen Equipment Company for the bid amount of \$865,858. Expected delivery is fall 2024. GH

Rock Springs – Rehab RW 3/21 and TW Lighting: Project was awarded to Electrical Connections, Inc., with construction to start in spring 2024. TD

Rock Springs – Rehabilitate and Expand Commercial Terminal: A new CMAR has been selected. An inventory of all of the work done to-date has been performed to identify work that is complete and accepted, unacceptable, needs to be removed, etc. This information will inform the new CMAR's bid estimate. MP

Rock Springs – **Acquire SRE:** Project will acquire a front mounted broom. This project utilized a RFP process. The selected manufacturer was M-B companies with a proposed cost of \$735,335. Expected delivery is June 2025. GH

Sheridan – Acquire SRE: Award was made June 21, 2022 in the amount of \$305,893 to Jack's Truck Center of Gillette, WY. Expected delivery is fall of 2023. Most SRE that were bid with the addition of Henke Plows are being delayed due to the manufacturer's relocation. New expected delivery is now March 2024. GH

Wheatland – Acquire Hangar Land: Project is nearing completion at 99%. Currently awaiting closeout report. EW

AIR SERVICE: Mariah Johnson

Air Service Enhancement Program (ASEP):

Cheyenne – ASCYS06: Once to twice daily flights to Denver Intl Airport on United Express operated by SkyWest beginning early September through June 30, 2024. January had a load factor of 65%, while February had a load factor of 74%. The booked load factor for March is 64%.

<u>Original Scope</u>: Once to twice-daily service to Denver Intl. Airport on United Express operated by SkyWest

<u>Term</u>: Early September 2023 through June 30, 2024 State Match: \$1,350,000 / 60%

Casper – ASCPR04: Once daily flight to Salt Lake City, UT on Delta Connection operated by SkyWest beginning July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. In July, the flight began operating on a CRJ-900, increasing seat capacity to 76, which has contributed to lower load factors. The load factor in January was at 44% and February's load factor was at 41%. March's booked load factor is currently at 31.5%.

<u>Original Scope</u>: Once daily service to Salt Lake City on Delta Connection operated by SkyWest

<u>Term</u>: July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024

State Match: \$320,000 / 40%

Capacity Purchase Agreement (CPA):

In July, we began the second year of the second threeyear term of the CPA contract with SkyWest. Block hour rates for this year increased on average 3% from the previous year. While all markets are still lacking needed capacity, two flights each week were added to the schedule for Riverton and Rock Springs in May, and Gillette and Sheridan gained an additional two flights per week beginning November 1st.

Northeast Wyoming Regional Airport-Gillette (GCC): Load factors continue to be strong, with January at 76% and February at 81%. The booked load factor for March is currently at 67%. SkyWest was able to add two additional flights to the schedule each week in November, bringing the total weekly flights to 14.

Original Scope: Additional third daily roundtrip on peak days, daily during the summer months. Reduced frequencies were implemented in April 2020 but beginning in June 2021 flights were restored to the original scope of 3 daily and reduced to 2 daily starting in November, falling again to 12 per week in January 2022. Two additional weekly frequencies were added back to the schedule beginning November 1, 2023.

Term 1: July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023

Grant: \$2,660,000 / 60%

<u>Term 2</u>: July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024 <u>Grant/State Match</u>: \$2,760,000 / 60% <u>Term 3</u>: July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025 <u>Grant/State Match</u>: \$2,880,000 / 60%

Southwest Wyoming Regional Airport-Rock Springs

(RKS): January saw a load factor of 69%, while February was at 68%. The booked load factor for March is at 73%. SkyWest's crew-driven flight reductions starting in February 2022 had limited the market to one daily trip; however, a second flight two days each week was added back to the schedule in May, bringing the total weekly flights to 9.

Original Scope: Two daily roundtrips, 3rd daily

Jun - Aug. Post COVID, the market retained close to daily service up until June 2021 when it increased to double daily. As of February 2022, the market dropped to one daily and added a second flight in May to two days each week.

Original Scope: Two daily roundtrips Mar-Dec, one daily Jan-Feb starting January 12, 2020 with second flight on Mon., Thurs., Fri., Sun. Overnight flight tagged with Sheridan (SHR). Reduced to one daily as of February 11, 2022.
