An adjustment is being made to the FY2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan Project Write-Ups under the strategy for Traffic Safety Outreach and Education. Wyoming added the target number 7. S-4 Number of emergency response roadside crashes (State).

The Performance Measure S-4 Number of emergency response roadside crashes was based on 2022 State data, as guided by 23 CFR 1300.11(b)(3)(ii)(B)(3). Wyoming is looking to maintain a five (5) year low of 118 crashes. A review of recent crash data shows the number of roadside crashes has been decreasing. The current 5 year average of emergency response roadside crashes (2018-2022) is 133.

The standard is enforced by intensive monitoring through law enforcement agencies with alcohol testing mandated for each participant. This combination of strict monitoring and a no-use standard with swift, certain, and meaningful, but usually not severe, consequences has been extremely successful. The project activities will purchase software and tests, provide training to county officials implementing the 24/7 Program, purchase computers, peripheral equipment, supplies and travel expenses as required to facilitate the startup of additional 24/7 Programs.
